Personal visitors are welcome every Tuesday, otherwise by appointment.

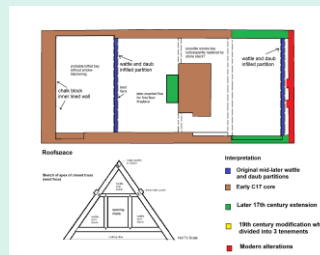
